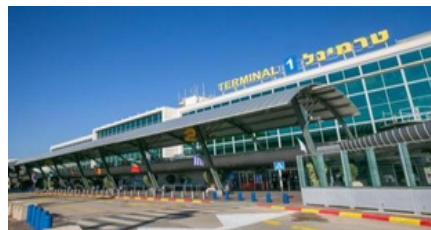
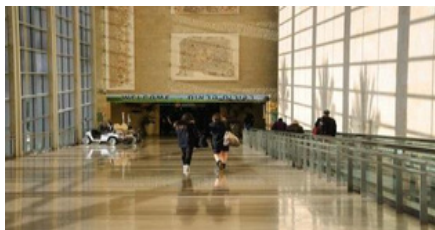

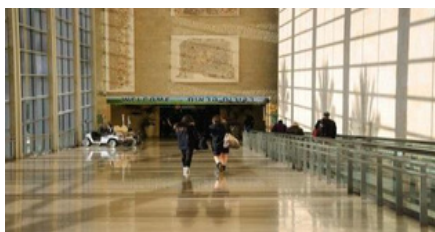
Thursday, 18 Jun 2026

Friday, 19 Jun 2026

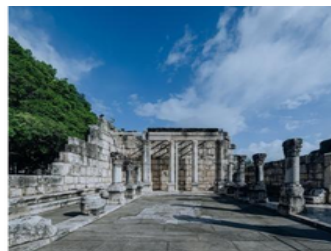


- After landing at **Tel Aviv airport**, we will meet our tour guide, and transfer to the hotel in Tiberias to check in and rest before the pilgrimage

## DAY 3

Saturday, 20 Jun 2026



- **Mount of Beatitudes** is one of the key places on the path of Jesus in the Galilee. Up to this mountain, Jesus Christ spoke the words of the Sermon on a Mount, some scholars call it “The Constitution of the Kingdom”. If you read only this sermon you would understand the whole teaching of the Messiah, the immense greatness of His love and grace.

Bible reference – Matthew 5-7

- **Tabgha** – the place where Christ performed a miracle of multiplication of bread and fish. Also, the parable of a Sower was told in these grounds. There is a beautiful Church of Multiplication. Bible reference - Matthew 13:1; Mark 4:1; Luke 9:13

- **Capernaum**. The Bible calls this place “town of Jesus”, for Christ Himself chose Capernaum as kind of a base of His ministry around the Sea of Galilee. Many miracles and wonders were performed in Capernaum but not one local guy ever repented. That’s why Jesus, in fact, cursed the whole area around



Capernaum: Chorazin, Bethsaida... We will read some portions from the Gospels to have wide insight into what happened in Capernaum during the lifetime of the Messiah. Mark 1:21-28; Mark 2:1-7

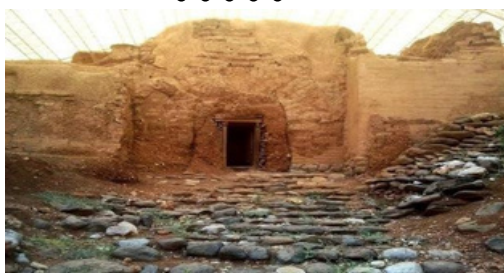
- **Beit saida** is mentioned several times in the New Testament as the birthplace of three of Jesus' disciples: Peter, Andrew, and Philip (John 1:45) and Jesus healed the blind man (Mark 8:22-26).

- **Sea of Galilee**, where Jesus walked on the water (Mat. 14: 22-23).

## DAY 4

Sunday, 21 Jun 2026



- **Tel Dan**, located in northern Israel, holds significant biblical importance. It was a major city in the territory of the tribe of Dan and marked the northernmost boundary of ancient Israel, often referenced in the phrase “from Dan to Beersheba” (Judges 20:1). Tel Dan is notable for its association with idolatry. King Jeroboam I established a golden calf there as an alternative worship site to Jerusalem (1 Kings 12:26-30), which became a center of false worship.

- **Caesarea Philippi** – nowadays National Park Banias. In the New Testament times it was a central city of the Eastern part of Israel which was called Syro-Phoenecia. According to the Gospels of Matthew and Mark, Jesus took His disciples there, and Peter confessed Jesus as Christ. Banias is one of the key spots on the trail walked by the Savior.  
Bible reference – Matthew 16:13; Mark 8:27

- **Mount Bental**, located in the Golan Heights of northern Israel, is a significant and historically rich site. Rising to an elevation of 1,165 meters (3,822 feet), Mount Bental offers breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding landscape, including the Sea of Galilee, Mount Hermon, and the Syrian border. One of the notable features of Mount Bental is its strategic importance in the region's history. During the Six-Day War in 1967, Israel captured the Golan Heights from Syria, and Mount Bental played a crucial role in the conflict. Today, the mountain serves as a reminder of the geopolitical complexities in the area.

## DAY 5

Monday, 22 Jun 2026



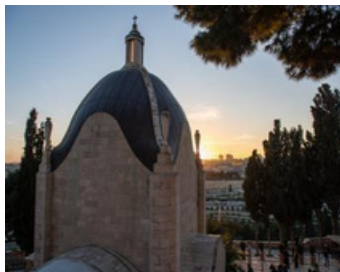


- **Muhraka**, where Elijah fought with the priests of Ba'al (1 King 18:17-40). From the roofs of this Monastery, we have a beautiful view of the Jezreel Plain.
- **Mt Tabor**, we will visit the Church of Transfiguration (Mat. 17:1-8).
- **Megiddo**, named also Armageddon - the place where the last battle of mankind is due to take place (Revelation 16:16) - where we shall visit the Museum and this 5,000-year-old city with the Gates from the times of King Solomon and the old Canaanite temples.
- **Ma'ayan Harod** - Spring rises in a cave on the slope of the Gilboa mountain. It is called the Cave of Gideon after the Biblical judge who collected his warriors here to fight the Midianites.

**DAY 6**

**Tuesday, 23 Jun 2026**



- Mount of Olives (Chapel of the Ascension-Acts 1, Church of the Pater Noster-Luke 11:1-4, Bethphage-Mat. 21:1-7) to enjoy a wonderful panoramic view of the Old City of Jerusalem, with the Temple Mount. The Mount of Olives is rich in biblical and Christian memory.
- Dominus Flevit Jesus' weeping and mourning over the holy city is commemorated in this sanctuary from the medieval period (Luke 19:41-44).
- Gethsemane, the place where Jesus was arrested (Mat. 26:36-58) and visit the Basilica of Agony.
- The Room of the Last Supper where Jesus ate his last meal with his disciples. The event took place on the second floor of a building on Mount Zion, Jerusalem.
- David's Tomb is located on Mount Zion, even though the Bible states that King David was buried in the City of David. The building where the Tomb is located is in the underground hall of an ancient Crusader church. The long Tomb is wrapped in a veil and is in the center of an inner room you can visit.
- Gallicantu One of the most prominent churches in Jerusalem commemorates the site of Jesus' arrest on Thursday night and his trial before the high priest, also the apostle Peter's triple denial of his Lord, his immediate repentance, and his reconciliation with Jesus after the resurrection.
- A short gathering for praise at the Lapid Gideon Congregation (at Pastor Birli's) and for the distribution of items

## DAY 7

Wednesday, 24 Jun 2026



- **the City of David** and the Pool of Shiloah, also known as Hezekiah's Tunnel. Western Wall or Kotel - The wall was originally erected as part of the expansion of the Second Temple. The most holy place for the Jews.
- **The Western Wall** of the Temple Mount is one of the most magnificent and significant remnants in Jerusalem from the days of the Second Temple, destroyed approximately 2,000 years ago. The tour of the Western Wall Tunnels allows visitors to reach the segments of the Wall hidden from view, and to touch the original and special western wall stones that tell the story of the Jewish nation.
- **The Temple Institute** was founded more than 30 years ago in the purpose of studying the various first and second Temple matters. The Temple Institute goal is to share and expand the knowledge we have regarding the temples. The Temple Institute runs a magnificent visitors center in the Jewish Quarter at the old city of Jerusalem. It is a beautiful show and a marvel to look at.
- **Via Dolorosa** (Latin for “Sorrowful Way” or “Way of Suffering”) is a route through the Old City of Jerusalem that is believed to be the path Jesus walked to his crucifixion. The route goes about 600 meters and is a celebrated place of Christian pilgrimage.

## DAY 8

Thursday, 25 Jun 2026



- **Bethlehem** to visit the Church of the Nativity (Luke 2:1-7).
- **Shepherds' Fields** Caves where shepherds “kept watch over their flock” still abound in the area east of Bethlehem. Here, the Gospel of Luke tells us, an angel announced the birth of Jesus (Luke 2:8-20). Beyond Shepherd's Field to the east is the plain known as the Field of Boaz (or Field of Ruth).
- **Ein Karem** the city of Judah and Birthplace of John the Baptist, son of Elizabeth & Zechariah and the Church of Visitation (Luke 1:39-56).
- **Holy cost museum**

- **Garden Tomb**, we celebrate the resurrection with a time of Praise.
- Evangelism evening and worship concert at Zion Square in Jerusalem.

**DAY 9**

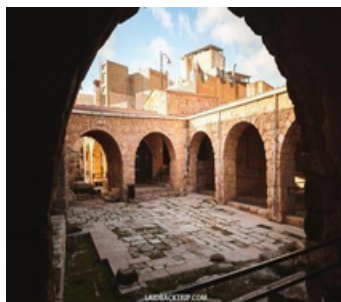
**Friday, 26 Jun 2026**



- Mount of Temptation is regarded as the mountain on which Christ was tempted by the devil during his 40-day fast. Jesus is tempted by the devil: Matthew 4:1-11, Luke 4:1-13
- Jericho. Right after the baptism, Jesus was led by Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by Satan. Two thousand years long tradition claims it happened on the hills to the West from Jericho. Jesus was tempted there for 40 days and nights but overcame it victoriously. Today there is Orthodox monastery at the top of the Mount of Temptation over the city of Jericho. After the conquest of Jericho, Joshua cursed the city and in the Old Testament in original language (Hebrew) it is called “city of dates”. Indeed, Jericho has one of the best dates in the world and a beautiful marketplace for that which is known around the world. Bible reference – Luke 4:1-13; Joshua 5:13-15
- Qasr El Yahud - the river where Our Lord was baptized by John (Mark 1:9).
- **Overnight: Leonardo Plaza Ein Boqeq.**

**DAY 10**

**Saturday, 27 Jun 2026**



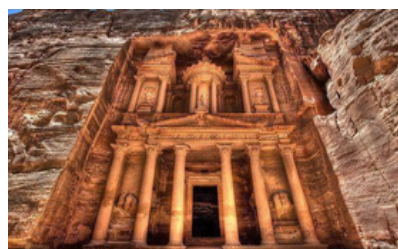
- Meet and assist at Sheikh Hussein Border ● After breakfast, drive to **Mount Nebo** and wonder at the view where Moses looked across to the promised Land and later died and was buried. Moses ascended Mount Nebo to view the Land of Canaan, which God had said he would not enter (Deuteronomy 34:6). According to 2 Maccabees (2:47), the prophet Jeremiah hid the tabernacle and the **Ark of the Covenant** in a cave there. A serpentine cross sculpture (the Brazen **Serpent Monument**) atop Mount Nebo was created by Italian artist Giovanni Fantoni. It is symbolic of the bronze serpent created by Moses in the wilderness (Numbers 21:49) and the cross upon

which Jesus was crucified (John 3:14). • **Mukawir**, known as Machaerus in ancient times, is a hilltop fortress steeped in Biblical history. It is believed to be the site where John the Baptist was imprisoned and executed, as described in the Gospels. (Matthew 14:1-12, Mark 6:17-29).

Sunday, 28 Jun 2026



• **Petra**, located in southern Jordan, is an ancient city carved into rose-red cliffs by the Nabateans around 300 BCE. Often called the "Rose City" for its rock color, Petra was a major trading hub, blending Eastern and Western architectural influences. The iconic Treasury (Al-Khazneh), Monastery (Ad-Deir), and the narrow Siq canyon are some of its most famous features. Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site, Petra is one of Jordan's most visited tourist destinations and is considered one of the New Seven Wonders of the World.
